We are a school that challenges our students to think deeply and to respond creatively. We care about ideas and our community


And maybe, just maybe, we are about to discover a great writer or philosopher in our midst.

Arts Centre Masterclass Collaboration







Debating Association of Victoria Public Speaking Competition

Recently, Albert Park College students participated in the Debating Association of Victoria Public Speaking Competition at Sacre Coeur. Melisand Box, Soraya Deferos, Leigh Greville, Leah Levin, Oscar Pearce and Marcus Sparrow competed against over 30 students from St Kevin's College, Beth Rivkah Ladies College, Sacre Coeur and the King David School.

The full day program consisted of a morning training sessions, a prepared speeches round and two rounds of impromptu speeches.

Students presented a prepared 5 minute speech on one of the following topics: The Media's Influence, Stereotypes in Society or Learning Outside the Classroom.

Students then competed in two impromptu speaking rounds. In the impromptu speeches round student were given a topic 5 minutes before they were expected to deliver a 3 minute speech. The prompts for the impromptu speaking rounds were Life on Mars, Fashion in Society, My Favourite Family Member and At the End of the Day.

A huge congratulations to all participants who spoke confidently and held their own against competitors from senior year levels. Extra congratulations to Melisand Box and Soraya Deferos who will be progressing through to the Semi Final competition which will be held in Term 3.

Food Technology

Appetite **P**repare **C**ook

Welcome to the second edition of the Food Technology Recipe Corner. This month, we focus on Year 10, who are learning about a Jamie Oliver pasta recipe and food fortification.

The topic revolves around the utilisation of ingredients as a carrier of flavour and students are also learning about how different foods are infused with flavour, fortified or enriched with nutrients.

Last week, students were required to make an Infused Crumb Pasta which involved making their own fresh pasta and sauce. At the end of the lesson, students reflected on their outcome of the task by asking: What went well? What didn't? What would they change if they made the dish again? What other ingredients could they have used to infuse the dish?

In the coming week, students will continue this topic in groups of 4 by investigating and creating a food product to launch that requires food fortification or enrichment. They will also be asked to make a poster using an App of their choice to present their product.



Infused Crumb Pasta Recipe

125g pasta (made at APC)
kosher salt
2 Tbsp extra-virgin olive oil (extra for drizzle)
1/8 teaspoon (or more or less to taste) crushed red pepper flakes
2 cloves garlic, thinly sliced
5 anchovies** (or more or less to taste), minced
freshly cracked black pepper
1/4 finely chopped fresh basil
1/4 cup toasted breadcrumbs
2 Tbs ANZAC biscuit crumbs
caramelised onions
1 tsp balsamic vinegar (extra for drizzle)
small handful of spinach and watercress

1. Bring a large pot of water to a boil. Add a big pinch of kosher salt. Add pasta and cook to al dente. Reserve 1/2 cup of the pasta cooking liquid. Drain. Set aside.
2. Meanwhile, in a small skillet, place oil, pepper flakes, garlic and anchovies. Bring to a sizzle over high heat. Swirl around so that all of the ingredients mingle together – 30 seconds or so.
3. Saute the breadcrumb and anzac biscuit crumbs in the infused oil until golden brown and crispy. Set aside.
4. Slice up half an onion and saute with butter and balsamic vinegar on medium low heat until caramelised (dark golden brown colour. onions should be very soft).
5. Place pasta in a large bowl. Add about 2 tablespoons of the reserved pasta cooking liquid and toss. Add 3/4 of the anchovy-infused olive oil mixture and toss well. Taste. Add more pasta cooking liquid if necessary. Add Chiffonade basil and caramelised onions and toss well. Serve.
6. Toss the remaining infused oil with the salad mix. Serve salad on the side.

Year 11 Biology - Marine Sanctuary Investigation

On Friday the 20th of May, the VCE Biology Unit 1&2 classes travelled to Rickett's Point Marine Sanctuary to complete the Practical Investigation for the third area of study for Unit 1. Each student approached the excursion with their own individual research question, designed their own experiment, and collected their data from the intertidal zone at Rickett's Point.

The excursion was very beneficial, as we all were able to record data personally and directly through the use of quadrats, providing a deeper understanding and interpretation of the data, and allowing us to conclude our investigation with an answer to our research question.



The excursion provided all members of the class with a clear insight into the intertidal zone, our specific organism of interest and its distribution, and possibly inspired some students to consider this type of profession in later years. Thank you to Ms Inwood and Ms Dodgshun for organising and supervising the excursion.



Intermediate Badminton



FACT: 6,000 bikes are reported stolen in the Albert Park, South Melbourne, Port Melbourne, and Prahran neighbourhoods. Police estimate actual numbers at 10,000 as many victims do not report bike theft.

Advice: *Please report bike theft!* It enables recovered stolen property to be returned to rightful owners, and It helps the VIC Police understand high target areas and allocate resources to support community crime prevention.



FACT: Keeping good records of your property helps recovery.

Advice: Everyone is welcome to stop into the Prahran Police Station to get their bike engraved. Keep photos of your bike on file and record the serial number (found under pedal crank case).




